Staying Motivated

Staying motivated whilst remote working can be difficult for many. Level 3 Year 1 Childcare students have been discussing how to keep motivated during their time at home to ensure productivity is maintained. As part of their new "Motivate Me" unit, the class has put together helpful ideas so that students can all make the most of their day.

Tips include working at a table or in a room with another family member so that you both keep each other in "work mode"; getting up at the same time each morning and going to bed at the same time each night to keep to a regular daily routine; and set the timer for 45 min and give the work your full attention for that time - do this 4 times a day and before you know it, you have done 3 focused hours of work!





Final Steps

Level 5 Early Years and Level 5 Special Educational Needs & Inclusive Practice students have been undertaking their final research project before graduating and moving on to their top up year at Kingston University. Topics covered include The Benefits of Pet Therapy for Children with Anxiety, Managing Changes of Routine for Children with Autism and The Benefits of Risk Taking in Play. Some students are able to proceed with their research papers, whereas others are drawing up robust research proposals to be carried out at a future date.
